Including agriculture in National Adaptation Plans (NAPs) has been made a priority for most countries, especially low-income ones, in order to address food security, livelihood and development needs. However, mainstreaming adaptation into sectoral approaches, overcoming cross-sector conflicts and optimizing adaptation investments during the planning process requires careful decision-making.

Organized by the CGIAR Research Program on Climate Change, Agriculture and Food Security (CCAFS) and partners, this side event will share outcomes, recommendations and lessons learned from a workshop dedicated to the NAP-process, held earlier in the week, bringing together 10 governmental representatives from the regions East Africa, West Africa and Latin America. A report entitled “Planning climate adaptation in agriculture”, synthesising national climate change adaptation plans, policies and processes will also be launched and discussed during the event.
